A huge thank you to everyone who was able to pick up their children early for last week's Learning Conversations. The feedback from both teachers and parents has been very positive, highlighting the value of connecting and sharing children's progress and learning. We are looking forward to the second night of Learning Conversations today. I strongly encourage you to contact your child's class teacher if you have not yet made a time to meet.

From time to time, I get complaints from parents and the community about unsafe parking, particularly at the end of day during pick-up, but also drop off in the morning. This has been an issue for some years and is certainly not unique to Adventure! I am not unsympathetic to the challenges of dropping your children off at the school gate and picking them up again at 3pm; I have also been a parent in that very same position!

We are currently working with Porirua City Council (PCC) and NZ Police to find a solution to our parking situation. We have been invited to take part in a trial to gather information about these issues. You may have noticed a police officer observing the parking and talking to drivers last Friday morning. This is part of the information gathering.

I've been informed that parking on the bus stop is currently illegal. I know this is frustrating when parking is limited. I am exploring with PCC how we can utilise this space as a pull-in/pull-out area for pick-ups and drop-offs, as well as a bus parking area when needed for school trips and Thursday Technicraft. Your patience is appreciated as we work through this issue. I will keep you updated with more information from PCC as it becomes available.

If you do have a complaint about driver's parking that puts our children at risk, the NZ Police have provided a form that can be submitted to NZ Police. Please contact the school office if you would like access to this.

PRODUCTION

MID-YEAR ACHIEVEMENT DATA

We are really pleased with our mid-year achievement data. Team Leaders shared this data at a recent board meeting. Below is a summary of achievement in relation to the NZ Curriculum levels.

Overall

- achievement in Reading, Writing and Mathematics has lifted and is now the strongest it has been for several years.
- Māori and Pasifika students are demonstrating strong achievement, performing at levels comparable to their peers.

READING > 91% are achieving at or above mid-year expectations


WRITING (Surface Features)
80% are achieving at or above mid-year expectations

WRITING (Deeper Features)
83% are achieving at or above mid-year expectations

MATHEMATICS > 91% are achieving at or above mid-year expectations

Many of you will be aware of the Government launch earlier this week, "Make It Count" – a maths action plan focused on key areas to turn around declining maths achievement across New Zealand.

Our current Standardised testing of Maths shows our children are performing well ahead of the National reference group, based on the current Maths curriculum.


