
Tōtara Spot

Science Roadshow

Out of the gate and off for a walk went the Tōtara students and the syndicate teachers, down to Whitby Collegiate to attend The Science Roadshow.

Awaiting us were many fun experiments involving sustainability, and the hidden inner workings of the human body. The scientists performed an amazing show about chemical and physical changes. We watched intently as they showed us the difference between chemical (where you add two different products to make a new product, and it can't be reversed) and physical changes (where you can add products to make a final product that can be reversed). After the presentation we explored and interacted with the experiments around the gym. Most of the Tōtara students' favourite exhibit was George the 'poopin' human!
