
Photographer Needed

SPOTLIGHT on RIMU

What a finale for Team Rimu and their space adventures! This term we ended our unit with a trip to Carter Observatory (Space Place). This was an opportunity for our students to pull all their learning together and to gain some very real hands-on experiences.

The Planetarium - by Nikau Anderson

The planetarium was a fun experience to be part of. They played 2 different videos called 'We are Astronomers' and then they showed us the universe through a star show. The universe is bigger than I thought. There are millions of galaxies. Also, they were rotating the dome roof! We got to see some cool constellations in the sky. The video clip talked about a big observatory in Chile, South America. It has 4 big cameras and there's a satellite in space. Well, I had never gone to Space Place before this, so it was exciting for me and I enjoyed it. The recliner chairs were comfy, but they kept moving. Overall, it was a really fun experience.

As we leant back in the planetarium chairs, we were transported into what felt like Space, you really felt like you were physically there! We worked hard to identify the different galaxies and recall the order of the planets from the sun.







In the workshops we also learnt about the different sizes of the planets to scale. Holding and seeing the different sized balls really put the planets in perspective. It was a fantastic and very valuable experience!

It was also a real treat to explore the new playground at the Botanical Gardens. Racing on the flying foxes, sliding down the vibrant yellow slides and eating lunch alongside some baby birds were just a few of the highlights. It was disappointing that not all classes were able to visit this thanks to the rain.



Our Visit to Space Place - By Hugo Banner

When we visited Space Place, we went first into their education room. In there we got to compare planets by distance and in size. First, we got to see the size of Earth compared to the sun. There was an Earth as big as 2cm and we guessed how many Earths that size could fit inside the sun. Then we did an Earth the size of small basketball and then a tennis ball size.



Then we got all the planets, but they were just balls that looked like the planets. The ball sizes were the same as the planets sizes, like Jupiter was a gym ball and Mercury was a small bouncy ball. And all the planets/ balls were all on a chair. We were all on a rug and the educator, Libby, called us up and she said it was like Mercury and the person would pick a ball the size of Mercury. We did that with all the planets.



Then we held name tags that had the names of the planets attached to bits of string, but they were all different lengths. The lengths depended on how far the planets were away from the sun, Mercury was 4cm long, Venus was 7cm long, Earth was a little longer and Mars was also a little longer. But Jupiter was really far away and then Saturn was even further. But then Neptune went across the room and there was string left sitting on the floor still! Wow!

Water Rockets Take Flight!

Houston, we have lift off! Rimu also launched their water rockets this term. After their initial launches, many alterations were made to the design of their rockets. Adding fins, checking the size and angle to alter the aerodynamics of their rockets were all carefully throughout and considered steps taken. Students stepped into the role of Mission Command whilst also learning about Newton's laws, the engineering design process, and working as a ropo. Our Adventure Way traits were truly put to the test! Our learners have really taken off!
