# Make-up & Jewellery

## Student Cell phones & Smart Watches with Communication Capabilities

- Students are not permitted to use cell phones or smartwatches with communication capabilities at any time while on school grounds. (i.e. As soon as they pass through the school gates.)





- All devices need to be turned off and handed to the class teacher upon arrival at school. They will be kept in the school office and returned at 3pm.
- These devices are not allowed on class trips, camps, sports events, or any other school activities.
- Please note, the school will not be held responsible for any lost or damaged devices.
- If a student uses a personal digital device inappropriately, it will be placed in the office for collection at the end of the day. Repeat incidents result in the device being held by the Principal until a parent or caregiver collects it.
- Parents and students are still able to communicate with each other, when necessary, through the school office.

## **Food/ Drinks**

We encourage healthy eating and drinking of water.



We have a 10 minute "Brain Break" at 11.50am and during this time, children are able to snack on a piece of fresh vegetable or fruit.

Please support our request that children **do not bring** the following items to school:

- Nuts and foods containing nuts
- Chewing gum
- Sweets/ chocolate
- Fizzy drinks
- Birthday celebration cakes / treats



As we have many children with severe allergies and special dietary requirements, as well as some families who not able to supply such treats to the entire class, **please don't send class** 

## **Toys, Trading Cards & Personal Items**

We ask that children don't bring toys or special items to school. These items often cause conflict or distress if they get lost or damaged.

Please note that the school cannot take responsibility for any such items that are lost, damaged, or misplaced.

## **Please Don't Bring Dogs onto School Grounds**

We kindly remind everyone that dogs are not permitted on school grounds at any time, including weekends and outside of school hours, unless they are part of a pre-approved, specialised programme.

This policy helps us maintain a clean and safe environment for our students. Unfortunately, we have encountered issues with messes being left in play areas and on the field, which poses health and safety concerns for our children.

# **Sun Safety**




## Hats
