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TŌTARA TEACHERS

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Dear Parents and Caregivers,

I trust you all had a restful and enjoyable summer break with your children. It felt far too short to me, but here we are at the start of a new year with plenty of interesting things to engage and challenge Tōtara students. This first newsletter of the year outlines what we will be covering over the course of the first term.

We continue with our structured literacy and reading programmes in the morning and then integrate our new learning into Inquiry in the afternoon. Our overarching focus for the first term is an inquiry we have called "Kō wai tatou", or "Who are we?" We explore the cultural diversity of our classes, syndicate and wider community, learn about our own identities, as well as other cultures and celebrate differences.

Our maths focus will be on number knowledge and strategy with a series of targeted workshops throughout the term. We will also be exploring Measurement through class-based investigations.

Our Technicraft sessions are now underway, with students engaging in exciting hands-on learning opportunities. Please note that students must be at school by 8:30am on Thursdays so we can take the roll and ensure they're ready to catch the bus to Brandon Intermediate by 8:45 am. For safety reasons, students must wear closed-in footwear during Technicraft. Crocs and other open-toe shoes are not safe in these practical environments and should not be worn.

BEING SUNSMART

EARLY START ON THURSDAYS

As already outlined in the newsletter, Please make sure you child is at school by 8.30am on Thursdays so that we can leave at 8.45am for Technicraft. Also make sure they aren't wearing Crocs or open toe shoe.

Languages will be starting in Week 3. Students will get an introduction in either French, Spanish, German or Japanese. Students also have the opportunity to engage in Kapa Haka and Pasifika groups, as they start up over the next couple of weeks.

Later in the term we have a couple of exciting events planned - a visit from the Blake Trust VR Team and a team sports day at the ASB Sports Arena in Kilbirnie. More information about both events will be forwarded to you closer to the date. Our PE/Sport within school will focus on ball skills (throwing, catching and hitting), as well as building teamwork through a series of interclass games.
